<u>Indonesian Unit Description for Term</u> <u>4- Pakaian (Clothing)</u>

This unit continues to help students extend their sentences and use adjectives in the correct sentence structure. Students learn to describe what they are wearing and what colour it is. This unit uses colours they have learnt in the Brown Bear unit to describe people's clothing. Vocabulary has been chosen to reflect students'



everyday wear, leaving room for separate cultural discussions about clothing specific to Indonesia.

Indonesian Unit Description for Term 4-Bermain (Hobbies and Sports)

This unit gives students language to describe and list their hobbies and sports. It ensures language is relevant and easy to use as children discuss what they like doing and watching.

Indonesian Unit Description for Term 4- Ramayana

The Ramayana is an ancient story that follows Prince Rama's quest to rescue his beloved wife Sita from the clutches of Ravana with the help of an army of monkeys. It is traditionally attributed to the sage Valmiki's authorship and dates from around 500 BCE to 100 BCE. We will use puppets and various forms of art work to bring this story to life.

Wellbeing




The new Child Safe Standards were enacted in July 2022 and are vital to what we do here at St Joseph's. What do these standards look like in practice? Each week, we will look at a standard in closer detail.

Standard 5 - Equity is upheld, and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.

At St Joseph's we hold termly meetings for students who have a Personal Learning Plan to discuss their individual progress and goals. We celebrate cultural diversity and we actively nurture and promote a culture where everyone is treated with respect and dignity. Our action areas are to work with the Western Trinity schools to develop a network plan for special days or weeks during school. Harmony Day and Day for Daniel are just some. Teachers and classrooms will observe equitable practices and develop an observation checklist.
