Introduction:

Watch the video on **St Paul's Letter to the Corinthians** (find the video on the 'Remote Learning Blog' on www.sjcoleraine.catholic.edu.au)

or

Begin by asking the children how they feel about being in COVID 19 isolation. What does it mean to be isolated? Is it lonely? What do you miss? Who do you miss?

Background:

St Paul knew the difficulty of isolation too. His job was to keep far away churches running even though he couldn't be there in person to help. St Paul was doing the work of Jesus, travelling and preaching, around 50 years after Jesus died.



St Paul couldn't be everywhere so he wrote letters to places like **Corinth in Greece**. He was disappointed to hear they had lost their way a bit and weren't really living good Christian lives.

He wrote to them,

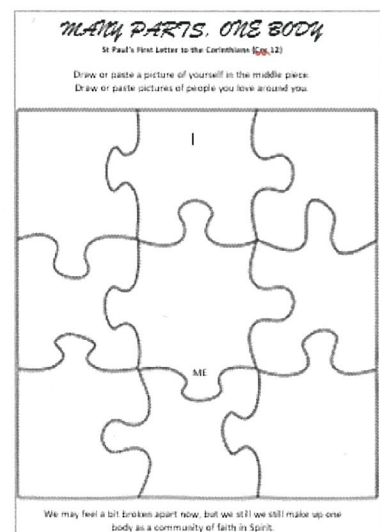
"We are many parts, but in the Spirit, we all make up one body"

Activity:
